

ADP Makes a Big Impact at Chicago Cares Serve-a-thon Event!

The Midwest Local Diversity Council united associates from Dealer Services and Employer Services to volunteer for the 15th Annual Chicago Cares Serve-a-thon. Over 160 ADP associates, family members, and friends joined 8,000 others to paint, create mosaics, and complete various landscaping projects for Chicago Public Schools. The service hours dedicated on this day helped to improve learning environments for 22,000 students attending 36 different Chicago schools!



After taking buses from the Elk Grove Village and Hoffman Estates offices, ADP volunteers gathered to travel to their project sites.

In addition to volunteer hours, senior leadership from all business units in the Chicago/Midwest region donated money for ADP to be a corporate sponsor of the event. Of over 70 corporate sponsors, ADP was in the top 10 for number of volunteers recruited and 12th overall for funds raised for Chicago Cares.
