

A Brief Timeline of ADP History

- **1949** – Henry Taub begins Automatic Payrolls, Inc. with one client
- **1952** – Henry's brother, Joe Taub, joins Henry's firm. The company has 12 clients and revenues of \$35,000
- **1954** – Frank R. Lautenberg becomes the company's first full-time salesperson
- **1958** – Automatic Payrolls becomes Automatic Data Processing, Inc. – ADP
- **1961** – ADP becomes a publicly held company; founder Henry Taub became ADP's first Chief Executive Officer (CEO); ADP has 125 associates
- **1967** – Annual revenues reach \$9 million
- **1972** – ADP begins providing recordkeeping services to auto retailers
- **1974** – Revenues exceed \$100 million; ADP expands into Europe
- **1975** – Frank R. Lautenberg becomes ADP's second CEO
- **1976** – Payroll processing begins in Brazil
- **1979** – ADP enters the payroll services market in Canada
- **1981** – Revenues top \$500 million
- **1982** – Frank Lautenberg leaves ADP and is elected to the United States Senate. Josh Weston becomes ADP's third CEO
- **1983** – ADP moves into its new world headquarters in Roseland, New Jersey
- **1985** – Revenues top \$1 billion
- **1990** – ADP has more than 200,000 clients
- **1996** – Josh Weston retires and Arthur F. Weinbach becomes ADP's fourth CEO
- **1999** – Revenues top \$5 billion
- **2001** – ADP enters the payroll services market in Australia
- **2002** – More than 500,000 clients use ADP; revenues are \$7 billion
- **2006** – ADP enters China with services for employers and vehicle retailers; Gary C. Butler becomes ADP's fifth CEO
